

"...let him deny himself, take up his cross and follow me." Matthew 16:25

I am not much of an outdoorsmen. You might could tell by looking at me, but unfortunately I didn't know this until I was several miles into a rigorous 3 day hike in the foothills of North Carolina. I had eagerly jumped at the chance to hike with some friends without any real understanding of the physical and mental preparations necessary for such an endeavor. I remember thinking to myself, while collapsing into my tent the night of our first day hiking:

"THIS IS NOT AT ALL WHAT I EXPECTED."

I thought that I knew what I was getting into, but it soon became clear that I was overpacked, under prepared, out of shape, and in over my head. Thankfully, the guys with me were experienced hikers. I remember one of them coming over to me at a particularly grueling part of the trail and saying, "You can do this. Just keep walking and follow me." It was what I needed to hear to keep going.

At the end of Matthew 16, something similar happens to the disciples. Peter has just confessed Jesus as the Christ, the long awaited Messiah, who had come to

redeem Israel. Jesus affirms Peter's confession, much to the delight of the disciples, who at this point must've thought they were all set to be the new princes of Israel. However, something very strange happens next. Jesus begins to tell his disciples that he must suffer and die at the hand of the chief priest and the scribes. This was not at all what the disciples expected. They thought Jesus had come to overthrow the Roman oppressors and rule Israel as her rightful King. Dying was not supposed to be a part of the equation.

Then Jesus says something even more shocking. He turns to his disciples and says "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me" (Matt 16:24, ESV). Jesus tells his followers that not only is he going to die, but if they are truly going to follow him, they must be ready to die as well.

Jesus goes on: "For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. For what will it profit a man to gain the whole world but forfeit his soul?" (Matt 16:25-26)

Jesus knew, and wanted his followers to know, that suffering always comes before glory. His call to his disciples was that, in oder to follow him, they would first die to themselves. This meant submitting their desires, wills, and hearts totally to the will of God. No longer were they to live to please themselves but to please the one who had come to redeem them from their sin. Second, Jesus calls them to take up their cross. This would have been an incredibly shocking statement to a first century Jew. The cross was not a simple of life or religion as it is today, but an instrument of torture and death. Jesus wanted the disciples to know what the stakes were for following him. It could very well (and in fact did in most of their cases) lead to death. But in losing their very lives for the sake of Jesus, they would find true, real, eternal life. This was the cost to follow Jesus. Give up everything you cannot keep, to gain something you will never lose. The call is the same for us today. Are we willing to give up everything to follow Jesus?

THE CALL TO FOLLOW JESUS SEEMS SIMPLE BUT IT IS THE HARDEST AND GREATEST THING YOU WILL EVER DO.

I did indeed survive my first hike. Finishing that hike might have been one of the most satisfying experiences of my life. Why? Because of how difficult, unexpected, and exhausting it had been.

But I'd made it. Thankfully, I had someone with me who had hiked the trail before and knew how to help me reach the end. This is why the promise of Jesus in Matthew 28 is so sweet to those who have committed to follow him, even to the very end. "And behold, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." (Matt 28:20) Jesus has walked the trail before us and promises, that if we follow him, he will lead us all the way home.
